TO AVOID HEAVY THURSDAY EVENING COMMUTE TRAFFIC, plan to arrive before 3 p.m. or after 7 p.m. There is a 15-min ferry ride onto the island. For ferry prices and schedules, call 1-800-84-FERRY. Or drive "around" and come across Deception Pass Bridge at the North end of the Island. See directions from North.

DIRECTIONS TO SHOW: From Seattle, drive North on I-5 and take Exit 189 (Whidbey Island / Mukilteo Ferry). Stay in the left lane of exit ramp onto Highway 526 past Paine Field/ Everett/ Boeing Plant and follow signs to ferry dock – OR – take exit 182 off northbound I-5, (if on 405 North just continue straight at end of highway), follow the signs to Highway 525 and Whidbey Island Ferry. Observe signs for *Ferry Only* lanes! Ferries depart approximately every half hour. For info on Mukilteo/Clinton run check: <www.wsdot.wa.gov/ferries> or call: 1-888-808-7977 in WA, outside WA 206-464-6400. When you exit the ferry on Whidbey Island, follow Highway 525 North approx. 3 miles to stop light. Turn right at stop light to Langley and continue 3 miles to Island County Fairgrounds sign on your left. FROM THE NORTH, take I-5 to Anacortes/Highway 20 exit and follow signs to Deception Pass. Cross Deception Pass Bridge onto Whidbey Island. Head south on Highway 20/525 for approximately 45 miles to Maxwellton Rd. Turn left and continue 3 miles to Langley Rd. Turn left.

MUKILTEO FERRY TRAFFIC

PLEASE READ RULES -- TICKETS ARE BEING ISSUED!

As drivers approach the Mukilteo ferry on northbound SR 525, they will notice two separate zones along the right shoulder.

SECTION A – Olympic View School to Goat Trail Road

The first zone (marked Section A on the map below) lies between Olympic View School and Goat Trail Road. It is signed as the *Ferry Waiting Area*, and within this section the right shoulder is available for *stationary ferry traffic only*. Within Section A, please use the main highway lane to travel in until you approach the ferry traffic backup. You are then asked to ease onto the shoulder and wait in line (please see sketch at right). All vehicles going to the ferry are expected to **wait** on the right shoulder when a ferry backup is visibly present (a ferry wait that is 2 boats or longer will extend into Section A). New pavement markings distinguish the *Ferry Waiting Area* from a normal travel lane by using white diagonal markings placed at 100-foot intervals within the shoulder. If no ferry line is present, motorists headed to the ferry terminal should stay in the main highway lane. In other words, the shoulder area through Section A **should not** be used to "drive" in.

SECTION B – Goat Trail Road to Ferry Ticket Booth

The Goat Trail Road intersection is the transition point into the second zone – shown as Section B below. Between Goat Trail Road and the ferry ticket booth, all ferry-bound drivers should drive in the right lane, *regardless of the presence of a ferry backup*. The right lane through Section B is referred to as the *Ferry Lane*, and is meant for *both driving and waiting*.

INTERSECTIONS AND DRIVEWAYS: Approaching the ferry terminal, motorists will see numerous intersections and driveways that are marked with cross-hatch pavement markings. These areas should be left clear of traffic at all times and should **NOT BE BLOCKED** by motorists driving to the ferries. We ask that ferry patrons waiting on ferry holding lanes be aware of drivers who need access to and from driveways and intersections. These drivers may be making right turns across the *Ferry Waiting Area* into the driveway or intersection. Or they may be turning left out of the driveway or intersection, across the *Ferry Waiting Area*, onto the regular highway lane. Please use caution. Please be patient with drivers making a left turn from the highway lane ahead of you. Do not use the ferry waiting lane to pass. **Note:** It is illegal to pass on the right.

– NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS –

- Effective for events held on and after January 1, 2004, the AKC will collect a \$1.50 AKC Event Service Fee for the first entry of a dog in all AKC licensed and member dog shows, obedience trials, and tracking tests. The current 50 cent recording fee will continue to be collected. A show-giving club shall assume the responsibility of collecting all Recording Fees and Event Service Fees for the AKC. If a dog is entered in more than one class in the show, the Event/Recording Fees to be collected on the first entry only. (AKC Rule, Chapter 11, Section 2).
- Dogs need be present only for scheduled judging and will be released if not needed for further judging.
- Dogs must be ready for judging. Neither the club nor its Superintendent will be responsible or obligated to furnish any service for notifying exhibitors or their agents of Breed or Class Judging. Judges need not wait for any dog holding up a class. Owners or agents alone are responsible for the presence of their dogs in the judging rings.
- No Entry will be accepted which specifies any condition as to its acceptance. Telegraph, e-mail and unsigned entries cannot be accepted and will be returned. Entries not on Official AKC Entry Forms and Photocopies of Entry Forms without the Agreement and Rules on the reverse side are **NOT ACCEPTABLE**. The Club and/or its Superintendent assumes no responsibility for wrong or incomplete information given on the entry blank by the owner or the owner's agent. **RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE COMPLETENESS OF ANY ENTRY RESTS SOLELY WITH THE ENTRANT.**
- Entry fees shall **NOT** be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, sick, lame, excused by the Judge or Veterinarian, or barred from competition by action of the Show Committee, or because it has been entered incorrectly. There is no refund of entry fee for bitches in season. There is no refund for **DUPLICATE ENTRIES** or **OVERPAYMENTS**. The Superintendent will make every effort to find all duplicate entries, but if entry has been processed, no refund will be made. If, because of riots, civil disturbances or other acts beyond the control of the management it is impossible to open, or to complete the Show **NO REFUND** will be made.
- **RETURNED CHECKS DO NOT CONSTITUTE A VALID ENTRY FEE.** The Superintendent will add a \$20.00 collection fee to the amount of each returned check. Subsequent returned checks from the same exhibitor or agent may result in their being put on a **CASH ONLY BASIS**.
- **REFUNDS** for cancellations due to judge change or cancellations made prior to entries closing will be mailed to said Exhibitor or Agent **AFTER THE SHOW**. An administrative fee of \$5.00 will be withheld from all refunds for entries cancelled prior to the closing of entries.
- Only dogs eligible for this show will be admitted into the show area. There is no provision for unentered dogs.
- The judging will start promptly. Dogs may arrive anytime prior to their time of judging, and may leave immediately thereafter, unless required for further judging.
- **LOSS OR DAMAGE** – The Show Committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of any accident or misfortune, to either dogs or exhibitors participating in these Shows. The welfare of an Exhibitor's child is assumed to be the responsibility of the Exhibitor. It is distinctly understood that Exhibitors will exercise control and restraint over their children on the day of the show.
- **TROPHIES & PRIZES** will be awarded in the ring to the person exhibiting the dog. No awards will be mailed.

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES

FRIDAY NIGHT APPROXIMATELY 6:00PM

Everyone is welcome to join us for appetizers and our guest speaker, Julie Kerns. Her topic is "Canine Genomics and the Labrador Retriever: How Modern Genetics Will (and Won't) Change the Breed." Kerns is a postdoctoral fellow in Elaine Ostrander's canine genomics laboratory at the Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center in Seattle, Washington. The Ostrander lab has been active in modern canine genetics from its beginning 15 years ago through to today, including production of the genetic maps used by all canine geneticists and participation in the genomic sequencing of a dog. In this talk she'll discuss the changes that genomics will bring now and into the future, not only for our efforts to eradicate genetic diseases, but also for maintaining the health of breed populations as a whole. We will also look at current research findings, particularly as they apply to the Labrador Retriever. There will be time reserved for questions and discussion after the talk. **Donate a Cheek Swab for Canine Genetic Research!** During the day on Friday Dr. Kerns will be collecting cheek swab DNA samples for his canine genomics research. Samples from all Labradors are desired. Collecting the sample only takes a few seconds, and it's easy and painless. In addition, all personal and dog information is kept confidential at all times. This is a great way to aid canine genetic research! *Thank you very much.*
